- Grew up in Japan, kids are adaptable
- Bilingual brain, multiple first languages (different personalities in both languages!)
- Taiko is also a language, a combination of percussion, dance, storytelling
- Pedagogy influenced by growing up in Japan, three grandmothers in the neighborhood who taught Stuart to speak Japanese
- Watching experienced educators is a great way to learn different pedagogies and practices
- The work is "responding to civil emergencies"
- Keep micro-communities intact during the pandemic via Zoom rehearsals, classes, meetings, etc.
- Practice outside, or inside with doors open
 - What supplies are needed to rehearse in the cold and snow?
- Harmony with the community is important
- Stuart/Burlington Taiko = Joy Factory

- How can we all bring joy to what we are doing?
- Bought toy lightsabers for each student, used them at the end of virtual classes with the lights turned off
- Squeaky toys to practice different rhythms
- School workshops
 - Would like about 4 hours of contact time with different classes, but timing is adaptable
 - Combat Zoom fatigue by drumming outside
 - Drums and individually packaged sticks delivered before school opens, becomes an art installation
 - Can happen in the rain or in the snow
- Stuart also plays congas, Cuban and Haitian drumming
- Burlington Taiko makes all their own drums (practice and professional drums) and repairs them and can bring up to 40 drums for a school workshop
- If the post office can deliver, Burlington Taiko can deliver!
 - Taiko can be brought to different neighborhoods, driveways, community blocks
 - On the back of the flatbed trucks
 - Where else?
- How can students continue to practice at home?
 - Cardboard boxes, buckets, plastic containers
 - Turned upside down or using packaging tape stretched over the top
 - Old tires wrapped in packing tape (so the sticks don't get dirty)
 - Chopsticks/pencils as drumsticks
